This is the City Manager's Report for the week ending July 27, 2018

# City Manager

This week, the City Council unanimously placed an extension of our existing sales tax measure on the November 6, 2018 ballot. If approved, the measure would continue to maintain Antioch's quality of life and City services. The extension of this measure helps ensure the City can fund police, emergency response, and code enforcement services. If approved, the new measure extends the existing, voter-approved sales tax at the one-cent rate to increase investment in code enforcement, clean up blight, road repairs, support youth and senior services, attract new business and jobs to Antioch, clean up illegal dumping and blight, and of primary importance, maintain 911 police response and resort and maintain the number of police officers patrolling City streets. All this would be done while continuing to keep these taxpayer funds LOCAL, maximizing local control for local needs.



Mayor Kuniyasu Kuki of Chichibu City Japan and a delegation of 13 others will be visiting Antioch July 30th thru August 10th as part of our 50th-anniversary sister city exchange program. Mayor Kuki's grandfather was the mayor of Chichibu in 1967 when the sister city

#### **Antioch Police Youth Academy**

In our continued efforts to build positive and lasting relationships with all segments of our community, we started our first ever Antioch Police Youth Academy. On day one, the new recruits were greeted by the Chief of Police, Members of our Command Staff, and even one of our City Councilmembers. Our Youth Academy is an intensive, week-long experience giving young adults exposure to various aspects of police work including training topics like SWAT, Traffic Enforcement, Police K-9 Deployment, and Crime Scene Investigation. Each course is taught by Antioch Police Officers who are trainers or subject matter experts on the topics they are assigned. This is a dynamic and interactive experience for both the young participants and our officers. We are excited about this unique opportunity to interact with the youth of our community, getting to know them and educating them about our proud profession. The ultimate goal of our academy is to provide our youth with an enlightening and worthwhile experience while, hopefully, bringing up prospective officer candidates from within our community to serve and protect this great city for decades to come.

#### Naloxone Hydrochloride

Naloxone Hydrochloride nasal spray is a lifesaving medication for those who have overdosed on narcotics or who have been exposed to drugs and are suffering life-threatening effects. Antioch Police Officers have been trained on the administering of this medication and have carried the kits with them on patrol for about two months. On 7/15/18, Officers responded to a call of a 26-year-old male having a medical emergency due to narcotics exposure.



The man was non-responsive, and Officers quickly rendered aid to include administering the Naloxone. After a short period, the man began showing signs of improvement and was transported to an area hospital where he made a full recovery. This is another example of how Antioch PD is providing non-traditional service to the community in our efforts to protect and save lives.







It's HOT, HOT, HOT! During the summer months, it is essential to ensure that your pets stay cool. It is best to keep your pets indoors with the AC on, but if you must keep your pets outdoors, please be sure they have access to plenty of shade and lots of cold water. Also, be mindful of hot surfaces, such as concrete patios, sidewalks, asphalt streets, and wooden decks in the sun, and refrain from walking your pets on hot concrete or asphalt. Never leave your pet in a hot car! If you're looking for a fun way to help keep your dog cool this summer, Shelter Dog Elliott, recommends filling a small kiddie pool with water and placing it in the shade for your dog. Elliott also wants you to know he is available for adoption, and that he loves napping on the couch in the AC after his morning swim. You can ask to meet Elliott at Antioch Animal Services.

# Community Development



At the August 1st Planning Commission meeting, a zoning text amendment to the Accessory Dwelling Units ordinance will be heard. Amendments include: clarifying that accessory dwelling units may be built on properties zoned to allow a single-family or multifamily use, allowing accessory dwelling units to be built in conjunction with a proposed single-family dwelling, reducing some parking requirements, and allowing off-street parking spaces that must be replaced when an off-street parking structure is demolished or converted into an accessory dwelling unit to be provided in any configuration on the lot.

On August 14, 2018, the City Council will consider a series of guidelines addressing the recent Ordinance allowing the approval of Cannabis Businesses in the City of Antioch. These guidelines will offer direction and clarity for the operation and establishment of a Cannabis Business and will serve to improve the quality of applications and operations in the City of Antioch. On Jul 24, 2018, the City Council will consider the Black Diamond Ranch 4 project, which consists of nine new



single-family homes within the existing Black Diamond Ranch community. Eight of these homes will be located along Countryside Way, and one will be on Torgensen Court. Currently, these sites are part of a larger open space parcel that was once contemplated for development.

#### Street Maintenance

Our Street Maintenance crews completed repainting all of the CROSSWALKS and STOP legends in our school zones in preparation for the upcoming school year.

This annual service keeps the pedestrian crossing areas clearly marked for motorists. Crosswalks and Stop legends in school zones are painted yellow as per Cal Trans specifications.

Water Distribution crews installed a new fire-line backflow preventiondevice at Antioch High School this week. You can see the old device on the grass behind Distribution Operator, Sean Watson as he builds the new device before installation. Fireline backflow prevention devices commonly known as DCDA's or Detector Check Dual Assemblies, are required by law to protect municipal water systems by preventing stagnant or contaminated water from either back-flowing or back-siphoning into the potable water system.

Maintaining, replacing and testing backflow devices for commercial, residential, irrigation, and fire line applications are just a few of the many functions the Water Distribution Division performs to protect our precious potable water system and serve the community.

A General Municipal Election will be held in the City of Antioch on Tuesday, November 6, 2018, for the following officers:

# Two (2) Councilmembers – Term of two (2) years for each office (Ordinance 2141-C-S)

A nominee must be a registered voter residing within the City of Antioch. Nomination petitions may be obtained from the City Clerk, City Hall, 200 "H" Street, commencing on July 16, 2018, and shall be filed with the City Clerk in person no later than 5:00 P.M., August 10, 2018. Candidates may submit a candidate statement 250 words in length and will be responsible for the expense. Statements must be submitted in block form; standard upper and lower case words.

So far there are six Antioch registered voters who have pulled nomination papers.

The regular business hours for the City Clerk's Office are 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. Candidates are strongly encouraged to make an appointment with the City Clerk's Office for obtaining and filing nomination papers by calling (925) 779-7008 or emailing Cityclerk@ci.antioch.ca.us.
