Environmental Resources

The City of Antioch is currently working on significant updates to the **Solid Waste Chapter** of the Antioch Municipal Code (AMC). These updates are **required** as the City works towards **compliance** with the new state regulations related to Short-Lived Climate Pollutants (SB1383). For more on the legislation, please visit **https://www.calrecycle.ca.gov/organics/slcp**/. The proposed AMC updates are an integral part of the required Enforcement and Inspection Program. Significate changes to the AMC include:

- Requiring subscription to the 3-sort (trash, organics and recyclable materials) program provided by Republic Services for ALL generators (residential, commercial, and industrial)
- Require all generators to use the 3-sort program correctly and not put items that can be placed in the Recycling and Organics containers into the Trash containers
- Require all property owners to educate employees and tenants on the program at the time of move-in/hire AND annually
- Employers will require employees to place materials in the correct containers.
- Require Food Recovery agreements/programs for qualified generator

Trash Capture Devices

The Collection's/NPDES **Division** recently had a crew clean our Trash Capture Devices. Trash Capture Devices, or TCD's as we call them, are vital tools we use to keep our **waterways** free of garbage and debris. Our Trash capture devices offer many benefits to the city. One of those benefits is the collection of harmful pollutants such as garbage before they fully reach the storm system or any bodies of water such as our creek system or the **San Joaquin** River.

TCD's **protect** the environment and **wildlife** from harmful pollutants. They are fairly low maintenance and help us meet our local and **state requirements** to protect Antioch's water quality. The TCD's collect the debris, and our maintenance crews clean the TCD's and properly dispose of the garbage rather than pollute our community.



PUBLIC WORKS

Only Rain Down the Drain

Our storm drains don't filter what we put into them. They run directly into our creeks and rivers. To help keep them clean, properly dispose of your motor oil, pick up after your pet, take your car to a car wash and follow the directions when you spray and fertilize your yard. Polluted stormwater runoff can have many adverse effects on plants, fish, animals, and people.

- Sediment can cloud the water and make it difficult or impossible for aquatic plants to grow. Sediment also can destroy aquatic habitats.
- Excess nutrients can cause algae blooms. When algae die, they sink to the bottom and decompose in a process that removes oxygen from the water. Fish and other aquatic organisms can't exist in water with low dissolved oxygen levels.
- Bacteria and other pathogens can wash into swimming areas and create health hazards, often making beach closures necessary.
- Debris plastic bags, six-pack rings, bottles, and cigarette butts washed into waterbodies can choke, suffocate, or disable aquatic life like ducks, fish, turtles, and birds.
- Household hazardous wastes like insecticides, pesticides, paint, solvents, used motor oil, and other auto fluids can poison aquatic life. Land animals and people can become sick from eating diseased fish and shellfish or ingesting polluted water.

And remember, sewer drains and storm drains are two completely separate drainage systems. The sewer system takes all household wastewater from toilets, showers, and sinks through your plumbing system and directs it to a treatment plant.
