

Ralph helped create theater space in the Antioch Community Center downtown and served as 2009 chairman of the Antioch Chamber of Commerce, where he spearheaded the Vision 2020 program. This past Spring, Ralph was named Antioch's Lifetime Citizen of the Year. APD Traffic Unit

Did you know the fastest speed limit in the USA (85 MPH) is a single stretch of Texas State Highway 130? (also known as the "Pickle Parkway") No portion of the Pickle Parkway runs through Antioch, and it certainly doesn't cover Somersville Road. On July 15th, Officer Johnsen clocked a motorcyclist at eve popping speed of 85 MPH on Somersville Road. That speed might be legal between San Antonio and Austin, but certainly not in Antioch, California. If convicted, the **fine** for driving at this speed is \$490 and an additional \$238 for driving without a motorcycle license. Included with the hefty fine is a point on your driving record, which your insurance won't appreciate. Our Traffic Unit is outand-about trying to slow people down on our streets and through vour neighborhoods. Please slow down and save the \$728 in traffic fines for a vacation trip down the Pickle Parkway.

Cats at Antioch Animal Services Got Lucky!

With Antioch Animal Services' cat numbers at a minimum because of the COVID-19 pandemic, it seemed like the perfect opportunity for AAS to give their cats a **housing upgrade**. Thanks to animal welfare and veterinary organizations, AAS is one of 82 shelters across the U.S. and Canada, where cats will be living large while they wait for new homes. Dubbed **Portalmania 2020**, the campaign was headed up by the Million Cat Challenge, a shelter medicine initiative launched in 2014 with the goal of saving the lives of one million shelter cats in North America within five years.

Cramped housing is a big cause of stress and stress-related illness for shelter cats. For those felines, the installation of portals between two smaller cages can **create much-needed space and allow separation** of litter boxes from sleeping and eating areas.

Many of the cat housing cages at AAS already had portals to allow for double-sided housing for our cats. By receiving the Portalmania grant, AAS will now be able to upgrade the remainder of cat housing throughout the shelter to allow for double-sided housing of all cats.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Application for Master Planned Community

On July 28, 2020, the City Council will consider an application for a master-planned community consisting of **1,177 residential units over 253.50 acres** of a 551.50-acre site within the **Sand Creek Focus Area**, known as The Ranch at Antioch. The application requests the following approvals:

- Certification of an Environmental Impact Report
- A General Plan amendment,
- A rezoning of the property to Planned Development District,
- Approval of a Master Development Plan,
- Design Review and approval of Design Guidelines
- Approval of a Resource Management Plan, and
- Approval of a Development Agreement

The Planning Commission considered the project on July 1, 2020, and was supportive of the project and recommended that the City Council approve the project, including all of the above actions. This application will go to the **City Council for final action on July 28, 2020**. The agenda and staff report for the July 1, 2020, Planning Commission meeting is available here. Planning Division

On Friday, July 17, 2020, Governor Gavin Newsom issued new guidance allowing barbershops and hair salons to operate outdoors. Previously, these types of businesses were prohibited from operating at all. In response, the City of Antioch has developed a new no-fee express application for Outdoor **Businesses.** This application is simple to use, has no cost, and is usually approved within 24-48 hours. It is very similar to the current Outdoor Dining application. Though the recent State guidance refers specifically to hair salons and barber **shops**, this Outdoor Business application can be used for any type of outdoor business, including churches conducting outdoor services. Of course, only those uses allowable under the State and County Orders can be permitted.

City Clerk's Office

The City Clerk's Office is responsible for preparation of agendas and minutes; ensures compliance with legal noticing requirements; serves as the Elections Official for the conduct of general municipal and special elections; responding to requests for public Records; maintenance of the City's Municipal code; and management of the citywide records management program. The City Clerk is also the filing officer for Political Reform Act Documents. Copies of Campaign Statements are available on the City's website. Copies of Statements of Economic Interest (Form 700) may be obtained by contacting the City Clerk.

City Council Meetings

City Council Meetings are held on the **2nd and 4th Tuesday of each month**. City Council Agendas, including Staff Reports are posted onto our City's Website 72 hours before each Council Meeting. To

You are eligible to register to vote if you are:

- A United States citizen,18 years of age or older on Election Day,
- Not currently in state or federal prison or on parole for the conviction of a felony, and
- Not found to be mentally incompetent by a court of law.

Register to vote online or update your current registration. You need to update your registration if you:

- Move to a new residence,
- Change your name, or
- Want to change your political party affiliation.

Our repair crew is working at various spots North of Hwy. 4 on sewer main lines that have been identified as needing repair. We have a crew inspecting sewer cleanouts and laterals in the neighborhoods near Almondridge Park.


