As a prominent veteran's supporter, the City's goal is to always show respect and honor to everyone who has served our Country through service in the armed forces. A solution that appealed to all three of us is to move the Memorial to the median island where the Dog Memorial and flag pole are located. This allows us to create a Veteran's Memorial Wall and landscape the area where the Memorial currently sits. The City Council will consider final plans for this proposal for approval.






On Tuesday, August 13, 2019, the City Council will consider an application for a Use Permit for the establishment of a cannabis dispensary with delivery and Type N infusion at 2625 Crow Court. "Alluvium" will be offering general retail sales of cannabis products and accessories, will provide delivery with up to eight vehicles and will conduct an infusion operation - a process by which cannabis or cannabis concentrates are directly incorporated into a product to produce a cannabis product. This process



can also be used to produce edible products or topical products that are infused with cannabis. Alluvium Inc. will be using this license to create a "house" brand of cannabis products by buying cannabis and cannabis oil in bulk and repackaging the products for individual sale with Alluvium branding. The Planning Commission recommended approval at its June 19, 2019 meeting. Building

Construction will soon begin on the Quail Cove project by Discover Builders. This project includes 30 single-family homes on 5.59 acres in a unique double cul-desac arrangement. The project is located on the extension of Prewett Ranch Drive, just beyond the former terminus at Summerfield Drive. The project is located between the Verona neighborhood by Meritage Homes and the Promenade – Vineyards at Sand Creek neighborhood by Century Builders. Grading should begin soon with roads and homes to follow.





Approved Construction

On July 17, 2019, the Planning Commission approved the demolition and construction of a new Jack in the Box restaurant at 2505 A Street. The new Jack in the Box will reflect current corporate architectural styles and will be a significant improvement to the area. The complete plan set can be found here.
