



Mayor and Members of the City Council:

This is the City Manager's Report for the week ending August 4, 2017.

CITY MANAGER'S OFFICE

On Tuesday, Mayor Wright, Community Development Director Forrest Ebbs, Economic Development Program Manager Lizeht Zepeda and I were privileged to provide a tour of our beautiful downtown waterfront to Senator Glazer, his staff and guests from the Southern California and Sacramento area California Association of Realtors. Senator Glazer complimented the enthusiasm and passion Mayor Wright conveyed as he communicated the City's vision for this important part of our community. The Senator expressed his desire to help Antioch meet its economic development and community goals in any way he could as he returns to Sacramento after the Senate recess.

I attended the Mayor's Conference in San Ramon with Mayor Wright where Lou Ann Texeira, Executive Director of Contra Costa County Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO), explained her agency's primary role of approving or denying proposals to annex land to cities or special districts, form new special districts and incorporating new cities. Ms. Texeira cited the complex process of Antioch's Northeast Annexation and some of the challenges associated with that action.

I attended a gathering at the Antioch Community Center hosted by Keith and Iris Archuleta, which included Mayor Wright and Council Member Wilson, where Fred Blackwell, Executive Director of the San Francisco Foundation, and his team were introduced to several Antioch agencies, Police Chief Brooks and Parks and Recreation Director Nancy Kaiser. Mr. Blackwell communicated that the Foundation had recently redefined its mission which focuses on "People, Place, and Power." Through the Northern Waterfront Initiative, the Archuleta's are working on a proposal that will emphasize resources and facilities that will train future employees for the jobs Antioch and the region is currently pursuing.



On Tuesday night, accompanied by Captain Diane Aguinaga, I attended three of over 20 block parties that were held all over Antioch for National Night Out. The overall consensus from the folks we visited was that they love their neighborhoods, neighbors and living in Antioch. It was encouraging to see so many people enjoying each others' company, cooking up and serving delicious food and showing amazing hospitality to the Mayor, Council Members, Volunteers in Police Service (VIPS), fire fighters, police officers and City staff who attended this event. This is just another way to meet and talk to what really makes Antioch great; it's residents.

With the two-year budget approval process now one month behind us, staff is working on many of the Council's goals and initiatives, including opening the Community Development Department front counter in the afternoons, hiring code enforcement officers that will proactively address blighted neighborhoods and business corridors in our community, bolstering our public relations and marketing efforts, retaining and attracting businesses, and better communicating who we are as a community and what we have to offer. Our strong financial health, with over \$26M in reserves, will allow us to capitalize on the wave of interest from families and businesses that see Antioch as an attractive place to grow families and commerce.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

What to Expect When You Report a Code Violation – How the Code Enforcement **Process Works.** Residents often wonder what happens once they submit a complaint to the Code Enforcement Division. Without a good understanding of the process, one might feel ignored or that their complaints will never be addressed. Hopefully, the following information will be helpful to all of Antioch's residents.

There are many ways to reach the Code Enforcement Division to submit a complaint or otherwise ask for service – anonymous complaints are accepted. Due to the volume of complaints, however, staff only contacts reporting parties if it is specifically requested. Once received, each complaint is then reviewed to determine if the item being reported is actually a violation and if there is already an active Code Enforcement case for that situation. If it is a new complaint, staff creates a new case using an electronic case management system and all reported information is inputted. The case is then assigned to a Code Enforcement Officer based on the location and type of violation. This process usually takes 1-3 days.

A Code Enforcement officer will then conduct an inspection and issue a Notice of Violation to the owner and occupant for any violations found. This Notice describes the violation and provides a reasonable time limit for correction based on the violation's type and effect on the health, safety, and welfare of the public. Property owners will typically be required to correct the violation(s) within 10 days. We aim to provide this inspection within one week of the complaint, but sometimes have to prioritize more critical cases affecting public health or safety.

A re-inspection will occur on, or shortly after, the compliance deadline has passed. If the property is in compliance, the case is closed. If any violations remain, or additional violations are found, enforcement action continues until the property is in compliance. Enforcement action may also include the issuance of citations and/or abatement by the City.

At times, the Code Enforcement Division receives complaints that are handled by other City departments or outside agencies. When receiving such complaints, staff determines the responsible division or agency and provides the reporting party with the proper contact information.

To receive a status update on a complaint or request for service, please contact Antioch Code Enforcement via phone, e-mail, in person, or through the City's website. Once your request is received, the assigned Code Enforcement Officer will contact you with an update on the Code Enforcement activity.
