

Thank you for a great National Night Out. We had a **wonderful** time hanging out with **members of our community**.







JUNIOR GIANTS SEASON COMES TO A CLOSE



PASS2CLASS

What is Pass2Class?

Pass2Class offers free bus passes to Contra Costa students at the beginning of the school year to encourage the use of **bus transportation** to and from school. Pass2Class reduces traffic congestion and air pollution by reducing the number of cars being driven to school.

The 2022 program offers free County Connection, Tri Delta Transit, WestCAT, or AC Transit bus passes for up to two (2) students per household for up to two months. Applications for the 2022/2023 school year are now open, to apply visit https://511contracosta.org/schools/pas s2class-program/

DRAFT HOUSING ELEMENT

On June 28, 2022, the City Council authorized the submittal of the **draft 6th Cycle 2023-2031** Housing Element to the State Department of Housing & Community Development for review.

As part of their action, the Council provided direction to include policies related to **tenant protections** and inclusionary housing. The State is expected to provide comments on the draft Element by September 29, 2022





CODE ENFORCEMENT



WATER DISTRIBUTION

Crews at the **water treatment plant** removed one of the city's treated water pumps for repairs. The pump removed **delivers** up to 3 million gallons a day to the distribution system.



STORM DRAIN CLEANING

The storm season is upon us, and our crews are working in full force to keep flooding to a minimum. You will likely see these trucks picking up water or cleaning out storm drains. Throughout Antioch, we have **282 miles** of stormwater pipe. These pipes are entirely different from the sewer pipes that convey sewage to be treated. Our storm lines run straight to the San Joaquin River. Keeping these lines flowing is a vital part of any storm.

Our storm drainage systems are designed to drain the stormwater and untreated water into rivers and creeks. Storm lines need to be cleaned regularly. Routine **cleaning reduces** the number of pollutants, trash, and debris both in the storm drain system and in receiving waters. The City of Antioch also utilizes what are called **Trash**Capture Devices. These devices trap the trash in our storm drains, allowing our Crew to clean out more and prevent less trash from flowing into rivers and creeks.

ROADWAY PAVEMENT

For the preparation of the P.W. 678-9, Community Development Block Grant **Downtown Roadway Pavement Rehabilitation project,** PG&E is cooperating with the City to lower their underground utilities on 8th St. between B Street, and D Street. PG&E's work is expected to be finished by **August 12**, **2022**, and the roadway work is expected to start in the winter of 2022.







ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

MICROBUSINESS GRANT NOW AVAILABLE

The California Office of the Small Business Advocate has awarded funding to the Chabot - Las Positas Community College District for the Microbusiness COVID-19 Relief Grant Program to provide grants to microbusinesses in the counties of Alameda, Amador, Contra Costa, and El Dorado.

This program will provide grants of \$2,500 to microbusinesses that have fewer than 5 employees and earning less than \$50,000 per year that were in operation in 2019, still in operation, and were impacted by the COVID-19 public health restrictions. 












OPEN REWARDS PROGRAM
