STRATEGIC INFILL HOUSING STUDY

The City of Antioch has received a grant from the State of California to pursue rezoning up to **10 commercial sites** in the City to allow infill housing and/or mixed use development and to develop objective development standards for those sites.

The City and its consultants have been studying the development **potential of the sites** and will be presenting their initial findings from the study at the City Council meeting on August 10th. There will be an opportunity for members of the public to ask questions or provide comments on the project. The staff report will be available **here**.



DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS

PIPE LINING CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

The City of Antioch Collection Systems Division is currently working with the CIP Division **performing** a Pipe Lining Capital Improvement Project, relining the City's sewer mainlines primarily in the downtown area of Antioch.



Replacing underground pipelines can be a costly and messy proposition. Pipe Lining — or pipe relining — **rehabilitates** existing pipes without requiring extensive digging and saves time and money with more efficient resources.

Pipe Lining with an epoxy layer can restore water flow to blocked or leaky pipes without the cost, time, and disruption of pipe replacement. We use proven, proprietary processes to dry, clean, and then line the inside surface of pipes with a safe, durable epoxy lining. An epoxy coating has a **lifespan of 40 to 60 years.** It becomes a permanent barrier against future pipe leaks and corrosion.

RESURFACING PROJECT

Along with CIP and Pavement Coatings Corp, Public Works staff are working on finishing the Cape seal portion of the road resurfacing project along **Hillcrest Ave and Gentrytown Dr**. Cape seal is a two-part process combining an Asphalt rubber Chip seal and a Micro-surfacing top layer. This project is being completed on time with a **high level of quality** and minimal inconvenience to residents. Projects like these should ensure the quality of our roads for many years to come.





NEW MARINA MANAGEMENT SYSTEM

DOCKWA was implemented on July 1, 2021. It is an all-inclusive Marina Management system and seamless App that helps manage our reservation system and captures all the boaters' information, setting up automatic payments/invoicing. Boaters can leave messages through DOCKWA for **special requests** when making reservations. DOCKWA gathers current registration and insurance information required to keep boaters compliant with the Marina rules and regulations.
