CITY MANAGER'S OFFICE

Grant Application

The City of Antioch has submitted a Grant Application to the Statewide Park Program requesting funding for Contra Loma Estates Park. City Council approved the authorizing resolution back in May 2019. The funding request is \$2.9 million to renovate the park; 100% of the cost to renovate. The grant application process required community input, and in July, we hosted five community meetings. Highest priority improvements from the community included: walking path for access into the park/exercise, fixed exercise equipment, picnic areas with BBQs etc., shade, climbing walls (the kids want those!), a dog park area, lights for security/safety and evening play on the basketball courts, and restrooms. Upgraded irrigation, landscaping, and more were included in the grant request. Recipients will be notified in September.

Transportation

Economic Development Director Reed and I met with the Head of Business Development for Neuron, (Southeast Asia's largest e-Scooter Sharing Service) that is looking to establish a presence in the United States deploying scooters. With an international presence, Neuron is currently bidding on a contract with the City of San Francisco and is visiting Contra Costa County cities to determine if there is a market for their services. While Antioch is not ready for this type of transportation option, we will be looking at how we design and develop our transportation system moving forward to accommodate electric scooters, bicycles and other modes of clean, efficient transportation vehicles and devices.

Homeless Encampment Subcommittee

The Homeless Encampment Subcommittee held their final workshop where ideas for addressing impacts on local businesses were discussed. Along with Mayor Pro Tem Motts and Council Member Thorpe who conducted the meeting, Chief Brooks, Community Development Director Ebbs, Eco.Dev. Director Reed and Public Works Director/City Engineer Blank provided staff expertise and answered questions. The findings and recommendations of the subcommittee meetings will be reported out at the 8/27 City Council Meeting.







Planning


On Wednesday, August 7, the Planning Commission approved an application to install a new electronic digital billboard at 2404 Mahogany Way facing State Route 4. The approved sign is 19' tall and 34' wide and will be mounted atop a 31' steel tube pole.



Code Enforcement - National Night Out

Code Enforcement staff attended a National Night Out celebration event on Tuesday, August 6, at Nelson Ranch Park. Code Enforcement officers presented information on Code Enforcement activities in Antioch and answered questions on specific neighborhood concerns from area residents. Code Enforcement continues to participate in the Mattress Recycling Council (MRC) program operated by the State of California's Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (Cal Recycle).

Since joining the program in June 2019, the Code Enforcement Division has collected 463 mattresses resulting in \$6,945 returned to the City.



The Code Enforcement Division also hosted a community dumpster cleanup event on Via Dora and collected six dumpsters worth of garbage and a truckload of electronic waste. These events are held to encourage disposal of garbage from households and to discourage illegal dumping.
