CITY MANAGER'S OFFICE

Tour of Antioch

I accompanied Mayor Pro Tem Motts and Council Member Ogorchock, on a tour of downtown Antioch with Senator Steve Glazer and his staff. The group of twenty began at Senator Glazer's office located at the Nick Rodriguez Community Center and continued through downtown to the Antioch Marina. Senator Glazer is a big believer in Antioch's potential and wants to help us tackle issues like affordable housing and homelessness. We appreciate Senator Glazer's leadership and desire to stay connected to his constituents.



The first phase of the demolition of the Amtrak station is in full swing. Funded by a \$300,000 grant obtained by the San Joaquin Rail Authority and \$100,000 from the City of Antioch, the vision for this important entry to Downtown Antioch is to create an inviting and attractive plaza for people to wait for and disembark from the Amtrak trains. San Joaquin Rail Authority has told us they are planning on running a commuter train from the Central Valley arriving in Oakland by 8:30 am each workday with stops in Antioch.



Celebration of Life - James McMurry

I attended the Celebration of Live for retired Antioch Police Corporal James McMurry. Proactive Enforcement Details

One of the biggest complaints we get at the Police Department are complaints about traffic. Proactive Enforcement Details are one way that we go about handling these complaints. Proactive Enforcement Details are when a small group of officers go out and try to address one particular issue without being tasked with responding to calls for service. Our most recent efforts were very productive. Five officers went out and collectively issued a total of 63 hazardous moving citations (hazardous moving violations are violations such as speeding, red light and stop sign violations, etc...) and (1) reckless driving cite that resulting in a vehicle being towed and impounded for 30 days. Officer's Prieto, Rodriguez, and Blumberg recently completed a RADAR/LIDAR school, which allows them to utilize a hand-held radar gun while working traffic enforcement. They put their new skills to task during this detail, issuing several dozen speeding citations.

Charity Poker Tournament

The Antioch Police Department and the Police Officer's Association came together to host a fun night of poker, food, and fun all for a good cause. Our Charity Poker Tournament was a great success with many City employees and community members coming together to raise money for our community give-back events, including the hugely popular Trick or Treat with the Police and our Holiday Food Drive and Adopt-a-Family programs. Thank you to all of the local businesses who donated to this event as well as everyone who came out and enjoyed the night with us.




Residential Growth Ordinance

On September 4, 2019, the Planning Commission will consider amendments to the City's Residential Growth Management Ordinance. Presently, the Ordinance prohibits the issuance of more than 600 building permits for new houses in a single calendar year and requires a new metering program if more than 500 permits are issued. The Residential Growth Management Ordinance originated in a 1998 ballot measure (Measure U) that compelled the City to develop a program to regulate growth in response to limited infrastructure, jobs, and pressures on schools and other services. The current ordinance replaced the original Residential Development Allocation program in 2014. Planning

Planning On August 13, 2019, the City Council approved a Use Permit for Alluvium, a new cannabis dispensary and delivery service located at 2625 Crow Court. The new dispensary will occupy the existing 2,740 square foot building and will offer a variety of retail products. This is the third permitted cannabis dispensary in the City of Antioch and is expected to open in the future following tenant improvements and remodel.

Register to vote online or update your current registration. Voter registration forms are also available at the City Clerk's Counter with free postage.

You are eligible to register to vote if you are:

- A United States citizen,
- 18 years of age or older on Election Day,
- Not in prison, on parole, serving state prison sentence in a county jail, or serving sentence for a felony, and
- Not found to be mentally incompetent by a court of law.

Landscape Improvements/Median Enhancements

This week the landscape enhancement crews continue preparing the medians for new plants and irrigation on Buchanan Road between Somersville Road and Delta Fair Boulevard. We also have routine annual landscape maintenance through contracted crews working in the medians and rights of way (sides of major roads) in the following areas:

Laurel Road - north side working towards Hillcrest Avenue – Rights of Way Davison Drive -north side is complete – south side in the coming weeks.

Contra Loma Boulevard - Medians Canada Valley Road – Rights of Way

Mt. Hamilton Drive – Rights of Way

Eagleridge Drive – northbound – north of Lone Tree Way – Rights of Way



Amtrak Station

The Amtrak Stop in downtown Antioch, CA, was completed in 1990 as a modern shelter beside the single-sided train platform. The structure has outlived its useful life and on August 15, 2019, the process to demolish and remove the structure commenced. It will take approximately one and a half to two weeks to be completed. Once razed, the City will re-purpose and beautify the area with an inviting plaza and landscaped amenities.

MMANC Summer Symposium

On August 14, 2019, the Economic Development Team attended the MMANC Summer Symposium/CALED Regional Training Cultivating Economic Development Through Connection + Community held in downtown Danville. Local government agencies gathered to learned new methods to cultivate economic development. Topics included economic development fundamentals that discussed key principles that drive economic development in a community and how the role can influence the direction of economic growth. The future of business incentives was a panel discussion, that explored the legal issues around financial incentives, the organizational considerations about nonmonetary incentives, and best practices for both. The panelist included: Kristina Lawson Esq., Partner, Hanson Bridgett, Catherine Ralston, City of Hayward & Nathan Donato-Weinstein, Business Development Officer, City of San Jose. Jill Bergman, Economic Development Manager, Town of Danville was the moderator. Other topics discussed were legislative issues in the economic development, and how to captivate your community through storytelling.



Cannabis & Commercial Real Estate

On August 13, 2019, the Economic Development Team attended Cannabis & Commercial Real Estate, A 2019 Update in Oakland. Kwame Reed, Economic Development Director, was part of a panel discussion that narrated the City of Antioch's approved cannabis process. Other panelist included brokers, economic development directors, attorneys, contractors, and industry experts who discussed their insight on cannabisrelated issues. Other topics included: legal overview, market segments and rents, construction/building requirements, revenue generation, and zoning.
