Mayor and Members of City Council This is the City Manager's Report for the week of August 20, 2018

City Manager

With an inspection issue that forced the much anticipated soft opening to be delayed by one week behind them,



Smith's Landing has passed all inspections. They are excited to ready to welcome their first guests this Thursday, August 23rd (*Delta Veterans*), Friday, August 24th (*Antioch Police Activities League*) and Saturday, August 25th (*Delta Advocacy*). Smith's Landing is generously donating half of the proceeds from each evening to the listed non-profits. We're incredibly excited about this soon-to-be-opened gem on the Delta!

Mayor Wright, Council Member Tiscareno, Community Development Director Ebbs, Economic Development Director Reed and I met with ownership and management of the Somersville Towne Center Mall to discuss the City's perspective of the mall and to have a dialogue around the City's vision regarding future opportunities at the site.

Along with Mayor Wright, Council Members Ogorchock and Wilson, and city staff, I attended a groundbreaking for Century Communities' Acacia Subdivision (formerly Blackhawk Nunn's Vineyard Subdivision) located at the southeast corner of Antioch between Hillcrest Avenue and Heidorn Ranch Road. This 320-unit phase of the 641-unit subdivision will include 210-units of gated active adult housing which is a new product type for Antioch. Plans for the remaining 321-units are in the works, and Blackhawk Nunn is working on planning for the property to the south which would have 50-acres of vineyards and over 200 additional quality housing units.





In the early morning hours of Monday, August 13th, an irrigation backflow was vandalized resulting in a burst water pipe causing heavy flooding of the City Hall Basement. Public Works Water Distribution was notified of the leak and secured the water source at 6:45 a.m. Municipal Pooling Authority was contacted at 7:00 a.m. and the cleanup and restoration process began shortly after. Restoration should be completed within the next two weeks as damaged carpet, and other property will have to be replaced.

Backpack Giveaway

In September 2016, the Antioch Police Department hosted an open house. That year, the Records Unit participated in the event by raffling off several backpacks as prizes. One by one, the backpacks were raffled off to school-aged children to laughter, and squeals of delight. That interaction invigorated the Records Unit to do more to help the youth in our community on a regular basis. Donating backpacks to students through the Antioch Unified School District is now a yearly event for our



Records team! They were able to give a total of 35 backpacks filled full of age-appropriate school supplies for elementary, middle, and high school age students. The Antioch Police Department fosters a strong sense of community engagement and involvement.

Lip Sync at the PD! The Antioch Police Department has answered the call of the Lip Sync Challenge despite it being just



another day at the office. We chose a "little break from the norm" and selected locations that highlighted some of the city's amenities such as the Marina, Water Park, and Animal Services. The response from the public has been overwhelmingly positive. Our video has reached approximately 500,000 people and has been viewed over 193,000 times by people throughout the U.S. and around the world, and shared over 4,600 times. Department will be on hand to answer questions and be available to members of the community to hear their issues and concerns. Please join us for a night of community outreach and productive conversation!




Police- Animal Services

More than 400 children enjoyed a summer camp experience this year; from Coyote Hills to Adventures in Fun & Fitness, and from basketball to Junior Lifeguard. Youth camps provide a safe and enriching environment to meet new friends, try a new skill, and have fun during the out-of-school season.

Fall Swimming Lessons begin September 4th!

Registration is now open online! Nearly 1,000 individuals participated in spring and summer swimming programs, and the City continues to offer a comprehensive swim lesson program for all ages. Instructors are certified by the American Red Cross and work to ensure each participant gradually improves their skills until they are ready to progress on to the next level. In all, there are 12 levels in the program.







Movie Mania takes place the 1st and 3rd Wednesdays of the month at the Senior Center. Members enjoy popcorn and beverages while watching the classics, Academy Award Winners, and some they have never heard of – like "Game Night" last week. Over the last week, 385 affordable, healthy meals were served through the CoCo Café. This program helps prevent heart attacks, depression, asthma and congestive heart failure. Planning

On August 28, 2018, the City Council will consider amendments to the City's accessory dwelling unit (granny unit) regulations. The proposed amendments are in response to 2017 State laws that made changes to the State's Accessory Dwelling Unit law. The proposed amendments include: clarifying that accessory dwelling units may be built on properties zoned to allow a single-family or multifamily use, allowing accessory dwelling units to be built in conjunction with a proposed single-family dwelling, reducing some parking requirements, and allowing off-street parking spaces that must be replaced when an off-street parking structure is demolished or converted into an accessory dwelling unit to be provided in any configuration on the lot. This will be a public hearing, and the public is invited to attend and make comments on the record. Water Distribution

Public Works water crews installed a new 12-inch water main valve at the intersection of Golden Bear Drive and Bear Ridge Way. The installation is part of a proactive plan towards the City's on-going efforts to minimize water service interruptions during planned and emergency repair work to the water distribution system. The installation of the new valve did result in a disruption of service to the Bear Ridge neighborhood; however, the benefits will be fully realized when future Capital Improvement Projects are made to improve the aging infrastructure to the adjacent Fawn Hill area without interrupting service to the Bear Ridge neighborhood.Our goal is to deliver the highest level of service to our customers with minimal interruptions of service. Thank you to our affected customers for their patience and understanding while this work was completed.

Our contracted landscape maintenance crews are working on rights of way (ROW) and medians in the following areas:

- Indian Hills Drive at Lone Tree Way to Sagebrush Drive ROW.
- Fredrickson Lane at Union Mine Drive to Golf Course Road ROW.
- Deer Valley Road at Bluerock Drive and heading north ROW.
- Empire Avenue at Lone Tree Way to Wicklow Way medians.
- Slatten Ranch Road at Lone Tree Way to end of the road medians.
- Viera Avenue at Brazil Drive to E 18th Street ROW

Semi-Annual Campaign Finance reporting (FPPC Form 460) for open campaign finance committees were due July 31, 2018. One committee failed to file and was reported to the FPPC Enforcement Division.

City Treasurer

Antioch City Council adopted Resolution No. 2018/102, inviting letters of interest for appointment to fill the City Treasurer position until November 2020. The current powers, duties and responsibilities of the elected part-time City Treasurer are set forth in Government Code and include adopting guidelines for the Statement of Investment Policy in compliance with State law, control of wire transfers, field check custodian, processing requests for Assessment District 26 and 27/31 payoffs, picking up property tax checks four times a year in Martinez, processing travel claims, reviewing paid warrants, preparing the Treasurer's Report and managing the Certificated of Deposit.

The following information is required for consideration of applications:

- Resume and a letter of interest not exceeding 400 words indicating interest, qualifications, background and other information useful for making an appointment;
- Nomination Papers with signatures of at least 20 but not more than 30 Antioch registered voters; and
- A completed Statement of Economic Interest (Form 700 from Fair Political Practices Commission, http://www.fppc.ca.gov).

Applications packets are available from the City Clerk's Office and are due by 12:00 p.m., August 31, 2018, in the City Clerk's Office, 200 H Street, Antioch. On September 11, 2018, starting at 6:00 p.m. in the City Council Chambers, 200 H Street, Antioch, each applicant will be asked to make an oral statement to the City Council not to exceed five minutes in length. It is possible that questions may also be asked of applicants. The City Council intends to make an appointment at the September 11, 2018, Council meeting, but the decision could be continued.


