Fires burning in the Bay Area are causing unhealthy air quality in Contra Costa County. Smoke from wildfires contain many air pollutants that are of concern for health, including particulate matter, carbon monoxide and ozone. Exposure to smoky air can make anyone feel unwell, with coughing, scratchy throat, irritated sinuses, shortness of breath, chest pain, headaches, stinging eyes or runny nose.

Coordinated Outreach Referral, Engagement program

Is five too young to start the recruitment process to become a police officer?

We were asking ourselves that very question when we met this sweet young lady who we are told is a HUGE fan of the Antioch Police Department and wants to be a police officer someday. She recently had a birthday and really wanted to meet a police officer! Her family is going through a bit of a rough patch and is currently working with Contra Costa C.O.R.E. to stabilize their situation (see below for more information on C.O.R.E.). Officer Smith (with Kona, of course) along with C.S.O. Adams decided to stop by and help wish her the happiest of birthdays.

If you or someone you know has found themselves without shelter, the Coordinated Outreach Referral, Engagement program (CORE) works to engage and stabilize homeless individuals living outside to facilitate and/or deliver health and basic needs services and secure permanent housing.

C.O.R.E. teams serve as an entry point into **Contra Costa's coordinated entry system** for unsheltered persons and work to locate, engage, stabilize and house chronically homeless individuals and families. The outreach teams identify individuals living on the streets, assess their housing and service needs, and facilitate connection to shelter and services. To notify a C.O.R.E. team about an unsheltered homeless individual or family, please call 211. Please note that C.O.R.E. teams are not designed for crisis response. For medical or other emergencies involving homeless individuals, please call 911.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Planning

On Wednesday, August 19, 2020, the Planning Commission considered a new development project and made a recommendation of approval to the City Council. The project is called Delta Fair Village and is located at the existing Delta Fair commercial shopping center at 3000 Delta Fair Boulevard, near the intersection of Buchanan Road. The project includes the demolition of the former Food Max building and another detached commercial building totaling 73,546 square feet. In its place, the applicant proposes a new **210-unit multifamily rental apartment building**. The project also includes improvements to the remainder of the commercial shopping center that would be concurrent with the new building.

As the property is currently zoned for **Regional Commercial Use**, the project requires an amendment to the General Plan and the Zoning Map to allow for this type of land use and building. The proposed General Plan Land Use designation is Mixed Use, and the proposed zoning is PD (Planned Development District), which allows for unique development standards to accommodate large-scale projects. In this case, the applicant is requesting a maximum height of 70', which exceeds the ordinary maximum height of 45' in the City's high-density residential zone. The Planning Commission recommended that the City Council approve the **Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration**, approve the General Plan amendment and rezoning, approve a Use Permit for the project, and approve the **architectural designs of the building and shopping center.**

The City Council is tentatively scheduled to consider this application at its September 22, 2020 meeting. The Planning Commission agenda with the staff report and the video of the meeting is available here

Operations and Utilities

Our Collections (Sewer) line maintenance crews are performing essential sewer line cleaning maintenance with our hydro flushing trucks. We have two crews that are working. One is in District 4, north of Hwy. 4, and the other is working in District 1, east of A St. Our underground repair crew is working at various locations throughout the City on sewer main lines that have been identified as needing repair. Our NPDES crew is working in East Antioch Creek just off Hillcrest Ave. near Lone Tree Way performing fire abatement and trash removal per the Contra Costa Clean Water program. We will also be performing a cleanup of a former homeless encampment near Viera Ave. and Oakley Rd. After these areas are completed, the crew will be heading to the creek near E. 18th St. just west of Terrace Dr. for creek maintenance. Please stay alert in these areas and slow for the cone zone!



PUBLIC WORKS

Capital Improvements - Brackish Water Desalination Project

The City is in the final stages of this project's design to improve water supply reliability and



provide operational flexibility while reducing costs, especially during droughts. With future proposed changes in Delta water management, the project will allow the City to use water from its river intake year-round, even when the salinity is above levels normally treated at the existing conventional Water Treatment Plant. The project utilizes existing infrastructure to the extent feasible to be cost-effective. The project includes replacing the City's existing drinking water intake and installing a new state-of-the-art fish screen, relocation, and replacement of the City's existing river pump station. This also includes upgrades to the existing Water Treatment Plant to install reverse osmosis treatment capability and construction of a new 4 mile reverse osmosis concentrate disposal pipeline to Delta Diablo's existing Delta outfall. Public Works presented an overview of this project at the August 11th City Council Meeting, which is available for viewing online here. More project information is available here.



Cleaning up of Medians and Landscaped Areas

It has been a challenge catching up with the overgrowth after the mandatory shutdown, but the crews are working hard to get our medians and landscaped areas cleaned and trimmed up. Thank you for your patience and understanding as we continue working to get these areas back to clean and green. These crews are working in the right of way (ROW= sides of major roads) and medians (middle of the roads), so please keep an eye out for traffic control and maintain a safe speed and distance for everyone's safety! Economic Development Department Hours






