In addition, the Amtrak Station demolition project is nearing completion with plans to construct a plaza to follow, and the new Marina Boat Launch restroom is close to completion. At tonight's meeting, the City Council will be considering a preliminary plan to relocate the Veteran's Memorial and improve the area at the entrance to the Antioch Marina with a Veteran's Wall and landscaping. A special thanks to Public Works Director Jon Blank and the men and women who continue to make beautifying our City a top priority.

Harmful Algae Bloom

Antioch Animal Services would like to remind pet owners the danger blue-green algae (cyanobacteria) can pose to our dogs. Blue-green algae thrives when the weather is warm and sunny, and water flow is low, which makes our summer months the most likely time when we can experience toxic algae blooms in the Delta, and our area lakes. Areas, where toxic algae blooms may be present, will often have the appearance of pea-green paint on top, or the surface will appear slimy.Dogs are most susceptible to cyanobacteria poisoning when they drink from or swim in, potentially contaminated waters, as ingesting blue-green algae may cause severe neurologic or liver damage.

Signs of blue-green algae toxicity include seizures, panting, excessive drooling, respiratory failure, diarrhea, disorientation, and vomiting. If you notice any of these symptoms after your dog has consumed from or swam in waters possibly contaminated with cyanobacteria, contact your veterinarian immediately. 

Planning

On August 21, 2019, the Planning Commission considered an application for a Use Permit for the establishment of Contra Costa Farms - a large-scale cannabis business facility at 3400 Wilbur Avenue. The project site is 9.2 acres in size and would retain and remodel a 2,400 square-foot building, and a 5,000 square-foot building for cannabis uses. In addition, four new buildings will be constructed – 56,440 square feet, 32,000 square feet, and two at 58,000 square feet. In total, the site will contain 211,800 square feet



of space. The proposed cannabis business includes cultivation, non-volatile manufacturing, distribution, retail sales, and delivery uses. The Planning Commission recommended approval of the Use Permit and the application will now be forwarded to the City Council for consideration at its September 10, 2019 meeting. Residential Growth Management Ordinance

On September 4, 2019, the Planning Commission will consider amendments to the City's Residential Growth Management Ordinance. Presently, the Ordinance prohibits the issuance of more than 600 building permits for new houses in a single calendar year and requires a new metering program if more than 500 permits are issued. The Residential Growth Management Ordinance originated in a 1998 ballot measure (Measure U) that compelled the City to develop a program to regulate growth in response to limited infrastructure, jobs, and pressures on schools and other services. The current Ordinance replaced the original Residential Development Allocation program in 2014. Park Improvements

The Capital Improvements Division completed Phase I of the Contra Loma Estates Park Basketball Court project this week. The contractor removed the existing materials, graded and poured the asphalt. The asphalt needs to cure for three weeks, then the striping and goals will be installed. This project brings two full basketball courts to serve this neighborhood. The project is expected to be completed by early September 2019.

Brackish Water Desalination Project Update

As part of the Brackish Water Desalination Project, the City's existing river intake pump station and fish screen will be replaced with new state-of-the-art equipment. The new fish screens will be installed on underwater piers approximately 50 feet east of the existing pump station near the old Fulton boat launch. River-bottom soil data will be collected in this area for the design of the piers using drilling equipment mounted on a small barge that will be launched from the existing boat ramp. Soil collection work is expected to be completed within three days starting Tuesday, August 27 through Thursday, August 29. To ensure public safety, the Fulton Shipyard Boat Ramp parking lot and ramp will be closed to the public while this work is taking place.

The Ancient Vines of Antioch

Video: The Ancient Vines of Antioch, CA - Evangelho Vineyards – The Economic Development Department is showcasing the City's historical roots with Evangelho Vineyard which is one of the most unique vineyards in all of California. Economic Director Kwame Reed narrates the video. The vineyard located on E 18th Street was planted over 130 years ago in Antioch. Unlike other heritage

vineyards, but very common to ancient styles of growing, Evangelho has a wide variety of grapes within the vineyard, including Zinfandel, Carignan, Mourvedre, Alicante Bouchet, Muscat, and Palomino. Before technology that allowed winemakers to blend and manipulate wines, diverse vineyards is what the expert growers practiced. Click Here to check out the video.

Manufacturing in the Future

On August 22nd, Economic Development Director, Kwame Reed, was invited to attend a panel discussion in Concord. The event was



sponsored by SynBioBeta, which is an innovation network of biological engineers, investors, innovators, and entrepreneurs that have a shared vision of using biology to create more sustainability. The panel featured SynBioBeta CEO, John Cumbers, Nishan Degnarian – Special Advisor to the World Economic Forum on Oceans, Nick Talken – CTO at Molecule, and moderator Amy Feldman – Senior Editor of Manufacturing at Forbes. The topic discussed included education, bio-tech, massive 3D printing manufacturing, and other issues related to production in the future.
