CITY MANAGER'S OFFICE


On August 25, 2017, the City of Antioch filed a second action in the Sacramento Superior Court this month against the California Department of Water Resources ("DWR") relating to the proposed California WaterFix Project – e.g. the Twin Tunnel Project. The City previously filed an action challenging the WaterFix Project's Final Environmental Impact Report. In its most recent action, the City contends that DWR breached the 1968 agreement between DWR and Antioch intended to protect the City's water supply from the impacts of the State Water Project. The 1968 agreement contains a specific provision known as the "me-too" clause requiring DWR to provide Antioch with terms substantially similar to any terms granted to any other agency in the Delta. In 2016, DWR entered into a new agreement with Contra Costa Water District containing terms substantially more favorable than those granted Antioch in its 1968 Agreement. Antioch believes that DWR is improperly selecting "winners and losers" with respect to the adverse impacts of the proposed twin tunnels project on municipal water suppliers in the Delta. The City contends that this is exactly the situation that the "me-too" clause in the City's 1968 Agreement was intended to prevent.

Over the past couple of weeks folks have expressed concern over their water bills and why they seem to have gone up so much. In response I'd like to clarify a couple of things:

1. The rates have increased effective July 1st as a result of Council implementing the rate increases identified in the Water and Sewer Rates and Capacity Charges Study approved in 2015. This study established rate increases for sewer and water over a five-year period. We are in the early stages of conducting



- a cost for services evaluation of our water rates with a presentation of the findings scheduled to come before the City Council in early 2018.
- 2. The City adopted two-tiered inclining block "two-tier" quantity charges for residential customers in 2015. Prior to 2015, all customers were charged a uniform quantity charge. The Boards and Councils of many municipalities seek to promote water conservation at the high end of the water use spectrum as their highest priority and use tiered quantity charges to affect water conservation. Some municipalities have uniform quantity charges which promote water conservation at the low end and middle of the water use spectrum. Pittsburg, Brentwood and EBMUD use tiered quantity charges, while currently CCWD uses a uniform quantity charge but is considering a tiered structure.
- 3. The City of Antioch does not have a penalty portion in the water rate structure. While many neighboring agencies imposed a "drought charge", the City of Antioch was able to maintain its rate structure that was approved in 2015 without any additional charges.
- 4. Most Antioch water customers enjoy average annual water bills that are lower than comparable service for customers at the cities of Brentwood and Pittsburg, and all the cities in the service areas of Contra Costa Water District and East Bay Municipal Utility District, as shown in the chart below.



PUBLIC WORKS

The Distribution Division protects your water. Backflow prevention devices protect our water supply from contamination or pollution due to backflow, back-siphonage, and backpressure. Antioch currently has 3,167 backflow prevention devices throughout the City. In Antioch, backflow devices are generally painted a light green color and are sometimes encased in a metal cage.

The backflow program is operated by Certified Backflow Testers which is mandated and reviewed by the State of California Water Quality Resource Board. Our Backflow Certified Testers are responsible for the annual testing, maintenance and repairs of these devices to ensure their reliability and protection.







POLICE



Officer Bledsoe and K9-Danto completed a K9 demonstration at the *Antioch Family Fair* this past Saturday. Attendees learned how Officer Bledsoe and Danto work together to protect and serve the citizens of Antioch. They also got to see how we use our K9's to search for articles such as drugs or evidence. Afterwards citizens had an opportunity to ask Officer Bledsoe questions about police work and our K9 Program.

Our Crime Prevention Commissioners also had a booth at the event promoting the benefits of Neighborhood Watch and handing out information on how to stay safe and deter crime. APD is committed to working with all members of our

community, building partnerships, and working collectively to educate and reduce crime in our great city.



The Antioch Police Explorers were out in force this weekend helping us educate citizens on how to reduce the chance their cars will be burglarized, stolen, or have property taken from them. The Police Explorers started their day off at Somersville Towne Center at the *Antioch Family Fair* where they "ticketed" cars with informational notices for "violations" such as valuables left visible or unlocked/unsecure doors and windows. Afterwards they moved on to the Slatten Ranch Shopping Center where they found more "violations" that increase one's chance of being a victim of theft and brought it to the car owner's attention with notices. The Police Explorers issued a total of **178** citations between these two locations alone! Afterwards they had a much deserved break from the heat. APD hopes that these "citations" will help educate and change people's habits so they are less likely to become victims of crime.
