UPDATE ON UNHOUSED RESIDENT SERVICES ••••









2021

In April of 2021, the City launched two pilot activities with the goal of testing a variety of program features as part of the City's future delivery of Unhoused Resident Services. The Laundry Voucher Program teamed up with The Church 4 Me and SHARE Community as part of their mobile shower services, providing participants with access to three Antioch laundromats. As of August 31, 2021, the Laundry Voucher Program has served 51 individuals and issued 71 vouchers. The Motel Voucher Program offers temporary respite of 3-7 days to people currently living outdoors. Referrals are generated by volunteer-based organizations, City departments and the CORE Team. Homeless diversion strategies and problem-solving are used to navigate resources. Exit plans are developed in coordination with service providers to ensure a stable housing option to enter once participants leave the MVP Program.

As of August 31, 2021, the City has issued vouchers to 32 participants for a total of 65 nights of stay with an average duration of 3 nights. A total of 59% of participants exited to more stable housing - 31% transitioned to living with friends or family, and 28% exited to supportive interim shelter provided as part of the County's Continuum of Care. A total of 9% of participants reported a return to living outdoors. The City continues to see the importance of evaluating participant experience to better understand effective practices and best outcomes. 



DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS

WORK PROGRESSES ON ANTIOCH BRACKISH WATER DESALINATION PROJECT

Antioch's Brackish Water Desalination Project, which was awarded last winter, has now progressed to a level of completion approaching **25**%. The Project is scheduled to be **completed** and put into operation in the **summer of 2023**. Once completed, the new facilities will produce up to 6 Million Gallons of drinking water per day for Antioch residents. This will significantly **reduce** Antioch's vulnerability to the impacts of future droughts.



The Project has four main components:

- Replacement of the river water intake pump station at the end of Fulton Shipyard Road,
- Installation of 3000 feet of 30-inch pipeline along Lone Tree Way south of Putnam Street,
- Construction of the Brackish Water Desalination Plant at the existing Water Treatment Plant located at 401 Putnam Street, and
- Construction of 4.3 miles of a **new brine water pipeline** will wind through City streets from the Water Treatment Plant to the discharge point at the end of Arcy Lane near the northwest corner of the City.

WATER DISTRIBUTION SYSTEM INFRASTRUCTURE

City staff is working on the City's Water Distribution system infrastructure, replacing a **35-year-old** 8-inch water meter and two (2) 35-year-old backflows. Water Distribution employees are responsible for nearly 33,000 meters and 3,400 backflows throughout the City.

Water meters are **tested and replaced** when they no longer accurately record consumption used as part of a water loss audit. Backflow preventers are used to **protect** the City's potable water and are tested annually and repaired or replaced when no longer serviceable.
