Many families are experiencing the adverse effects of the mental health crisis throughout Contra Costa County. According to the Contra Costa County Department of Health Services, approximately 1 in 5 adults in Contra Costa County experience mental issues. Individuals who have also experienced some form of mental health illness have repeatedly expressed frustration with the lack of city and county resources available to assist them through their most trying times. Cities like Antioch are routinely experiencing a shortage of resources that have impeded their ability to respond to urgent, non-law enforcement, low-level 911 calls for services. To address the increased societal needs for mental health services, Contra Costa County has ambitiously embarked on a joint and collaborative partnership with the 19 cities under its jurisdiction. In November 2020, Contra Costa Health Services assembled a collaborative team to initiate the exploration phase of developing a comprehensive mental health response to the region's mental health crises.

During the planning phase, the team created a concept that would assist residents in navigating the complex system of mental health services. The concept of Anyone, Anywhere, Anytime - "A3" was established during this initial planning process. The overarching goal of the A3 program is to provide timely, appropriate mental health crisis services to anyone, anywhere at anytime, in Contra Costa County. The A3 concept will primarily focus on both care and treatment, not law enforcement interaction. The City of Antioch leadership team understands the value of life. Every effort must be made to preserve and improve the quality of life for our invaluable residents. The A3 model accomplishes this goal by assisting those who require mental health crisis services in the most humane and dignified way. Together, with one shared vision of hope and collective action of accountability, we can all be servants of humanity.

Recovered Property at Rocketship Charter School

Our dispatch center received a call about an unfortunate incident at the Rocketship Charter School on Cavallo Rd. School staff reported the campus had been broken into and several things had been stolen. When such incidents occur, we have little to follow up on, limiting how likely we are to find and recover stolen property. This story, however, has a happier ending.



Not more than an hour following the original call to dispatch security personnel on campus reported seeing a female in the area who appeared to have much of the property stolen from the school. Our officers arrived again, contacted the 38-year-old

Antioch resident, and found her in possession of approximately \$5,000 worth of stolen laptops, Apple products, and other items from the school.

Surveillance video was reviewed and led to the suspect being arrested for burglary. The stolen property was returned to the school and, more importantly, to the students of Rocketship! The woman taken into custody will be receiving detention at the county jail in Martinez. The students and faculty were thrilled to have their property returned!

Neighborhood Cleanup Update

Over the last four years, the City of Antioch's Code Enforcement Division has held annual "neighborhood cleanup" events at various city facilities in Antioch. These events are a partnership between the City of Antioch and Republic Services to assist Antioch residents with free, lawful disposal of unwanted household items.

These events are anticipated to reduce illegal dumping occurrences since unwanted items are disposed of properly, and the number of reports to the Code Enforcement Division for junk/rubbish accumulation on private property is reduced. These events have become very popular, and the number of residents participating has grown significantly over the years. This year is the first year all neighborhoods in Antioch have received an invitation to participate in an event!

So far this year, Code Enforcement and Republic Services have hosted 13 cleanup events in various neighborhoods resulting in over 240 tons of unwanted debris being collected and disposed of lawfully! It is anticipated that this year, nearly 300 tons of trash will be removed from residential properties due to the expansion of these events to include all neighborhoods citywide.

Please check your mailbox for your invitation flyer from Republic Services to your event! Events are held March through October, and you will need to bring your invitation flyer to access the event and dispose of your unwanted household items at no charge! Thank you for keeping Antioch beautiful!

This inspired him to help fight wildfires in any way he could. Bruce took a Wildland Fire & Rescue class and put his name on the list to be called upon when a situation arises.



Due to his skill level and a commercial Class A driver's license, Bruce was called out to run water at the Mosquito Fire in Placer County. He not only drove a Water Tender for three days, but he also had to pay attention to wind and humidity patterns, worked long days, and had to be on his toes at all times to be sure that the helicopter he was assisting did not suck up any debris during

take-off and landing. Bruce said that thanks to his time in the Army, he was able to easily learn the communication patterns of CalFire's system with his team members. Bruce is not only a valuable team member in our community but also an asset to others in our state in a time of need. Thank you, Bruce!!

Economic Development Strategic Plan

On September 13th, the Antioch City Council adopted the "Reinvest Antioch" Economic Development Program – Action Plan and Toolkit. With the adoption of this document, the process of creating an economic development strategy is concluded, and staff can now begin the implementation phases of the Action Plan.

The Action Plan includes the following nine initiatives:

- 1. Business Development (Job Creation) Pipeline
- 2. Real Estate Development Capacity/Site Readiness
- 3. Workforce Opportunity Initiative
- 4. Entrepreneurial Development/Startup Assistance
- 5. Direct Project Investment/Public-Private Partnerships
- 6. Leveraging Housing Demand to Promote Economic Development
- 7. Regional Interface/Advocacy
- 8. Funding/Resource Expansion
- 9. Coordination with City (and Other) Foundational Functions
