## **Rent Stabilization Ordinance**

Contra Costa County is one of the most affordable places to reside in the Bay Area. Nevertheless, for some of our residents, finding an affordable place to rent is becoming increasingly difficult to achieve. To address the increased cost of living in Antioch, on July 26, 2022, the Antioch City Council, after conducting a special meeting on rent stabilization, directed the City Attorney to prepare a Rent Stabilization Ordinance. On September 27, 2022, the City Council introduced the Rent Stabilization Ordinance.

This progressive and unprecedented Ordinance is the first of its kind in Contra Costa County and the City of Antioch. It will bring much-needed relief to Antioch residents who find themselves between the increasing cost of purchasing a home and the crippling financial challenges of renting. Rent stabilization and rent control mutually regulate the total amount of rent that may be increased during a tenancy; however, only "rent control" regulates the amount of rent charged when the tenancy commences. When a tenant moves out, the initial amount of rent for the next tenant is not restricted. Furthermore, under the City of Antioch Rent Stabilization Ordinance, only one rent increase is allowable per 12 months. The City Council has set a ceiling on rental rate increases using a combination of percentage and a percent of the Consumer Price Index (CPI). The City Council introduced a Rent Stabilization Ordinance that proposes increases in rent on residential real property in the city that may not exceed the lesser of three percent (3%) or sixty percent (60%) of the most recent 12 months increase in the CPI for all urban customers.

In addition, the Rent Stabilization Ordinance has developed and implemented a petition process that is reviewed and determined by a newly assigned Hearing Officer. The Hearing Officer shall decide the Rent Reduction Petition within sixty (60) calendar days of the date of application submission. The Rent Reduction process shall allow both the renter and the landlord an opportunity to examine the fairness and equity of the rent increase so that it does not cause unnecessary financial hardship to the tenant or a financial burden to the landlord.

#### **De-Escalation Strategies in Use**

On October 4, 2022, at approximately 10:51 am, Antioch Police Department Dispatch was notified of a robbery resulting in a victim being stabbed in the chest. Witnesses reported that the suspect fled the area after the theft, leaving the victim on the ground. **Officers arrived** and located a 58-year-old male adult suffering from a knife wound to the chest. Officers immediately began life-saving measures and rendered aid. The victim was transported to a local trauma center.

Witnesses pointed the other responding officers toward the suspect across the street, who was later identified as 29-year-old Hakeem Thomas. Officers pursued Thomas as he fled the area through the hills between Fairview Avenue and Buchanan Road, at which point he stopped running. Officers tried to **de-escalate the situation** by talking and pleading with Thomas to give up the knife and surrender. But despite their efforts, Thomas refused and demanded that officers shoot him. Officers eventually used a less lethal projectile as a distraction device, and Thomas dropped the knife and surrendered without being injured.

We want to **thank all the community members and first responders** who assisted and commend the officers who responded to this incident. Due to their training and de-escalation tactics, the situation ended peacefully and without further injuries.

### Neighborhood Cleanup Update

Over the last four years, the City of Antioch's Code Enforcement Division has held annual "neighborhood cleanup" events at various city facilities in Antioch. These events are a partnership between the City of Antioch and Republic Services to **assist Antioch residents with free**, **lawful disposal** of unwanted household items.

These events are anticipated to reduce illegal dumping occurrences since unwanted items are **disposed of properly**, and the number of reports to the Code Enforcement Division for junk/rubbish accumulation on private property is reduced. These events have become very popular, and the number of residents participating has grown significantly over the years. This year is the first year all neighborhoods in Antioch have received an invitation to participate in an event!

So far this year, Code Enforcement and Republic Services have hosted 13 cleanup events in various neighborhoods resulting in over 240 tons of unwanted debris being collected and disposed of lawfully! It is anticipated that this year, nearly 300 tons of trash will be removed from residential properties due to the expansion of these events to include all neighborhoods citywide.

Events are held March through October, and you will need to bring your invitation flyer to access the event and dispose of your unwanted household items at no charge! **Thank you for keeping Antioch beautifu!**

## PUBLIC WORKS

### Sewer and Storm Maintenance

Our Vac-Con trucks offer many useful options for cleaning and repairing our infrastructure. When cleaning, we use over **800 feet of hose with 3000psi** to remove roots, grease, and debris from our sewer and storm pipes. While using our vacuum system, we can remove large amounts of waste up to 30' deep without causing any damage to the lines.

The Vac-Con has a 16-yard tank holding **3,200 gallons of** water/debris. We utilize these trucks to their fullest capabilities daily. This is just one of the vehicles in our fleet that helps make a clean and beautiful Antioch. We are currently performing essential maintenance with this equipment north of highway 4 east of Cavallo Road. Remember, if you have a sewer issue, please call (925) 779-6950 for assistance.

The Water Treatment Plant (WTP) staff is performing routine maintenance and cleaning at the Antioch municipal reservoir.

On September 13th, the Antioch City Council adopted the "**Reinvest Antioch**" Economic Development Program – **Action Plan and Toolkit**. - 7. Regional Interface/Advocacy
- 8. Funding/Resource Expansion
- 9. Coordination with City (and Other) Foundational Functions
