This is the City Manager's Report for the week ending October 13, 2017.

CITY MANAGER'S OFFICE

I attended the Contra Costa County Public Managers' Association meeting where we heard presentations from Contra Costa County Fire Protection District (CCCFPD) Chief Jeff Carmen and Contra Costa County Transportation Authority (CCTA) Executive Director Randy Iwasaki on the state of their respective organizations. The CCCFPD is pursuing Community Facilities Districts to fund ongoing operations in developing cities like Antioch. CCTA is aggressively pursuing driverless vehicle technology for Contra Costa County where we are one of the nations' leaders in this area.

The Antioch Chamber of Commerce will be hosting the EC2 Economic Development Summit on Friday, October 20th, at the Antioch Community Center from 8:30 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. Topics to be discussed



include: "The Jobs Highway" by CCTA Executive Director Randy Iwasaki, "Why Specificity Matters" by City of Fremont Economic Development Director Kelly Kline, and "What Tech Means to Us and Job Creation and Economic Development" presented by the Cities of Antioch, Brentwood, Oakley and Pittsburg, along with Contra Costa County. Building Inspection Services Division. This week, the Building Inspection Services Division issued another 13 Building Permits for the construction of new homes at the Park Ridge development by Davidon Homes. This project is really moving along and the City is excited to welcome its new residents.

Code Enforcement Division. On Tuesday, October 10, 2017, the City Council upheld the decision of the Board of Administrative Appeals, which denied an appeal over the enforcement of various municipal and building codes at the property at 701 Wilbur Avenue. At issue was the non-permitted use of fifteen recreational vehicles as permanent housing units, unpermitted construction of associated sewer and electrical service lines, and the conversion of existing buildings into additional apartment units. The Code Enforcement Unit will proceed with abatement at this property and will be looking to provide amiable relocation options for the many residents affected by the situation.

Planning Division. The Community Development Department congratulates incumbents Janet Zacharatos and Martha Parsons for their re-appointment and Bob Martin for his new appointment to the Planning Commission. We look forward to working with all of them on the many important projects ahead.

The October 18, 2017 Planning Commission meeting has been cancelled.

PUBLIC WORKS

SEWERS - WHO IS RESPONSIBLE? The property owner is responsible for all maintenance of the private sewer lateral (see illustration below). All problems on private property are the sole responsibility of the property owner. Please continue reading to help identify when the City can provide assistance.



HOMES WITH A PUBLIC SEWER CLEANOUT. The City will clear blockages in the right-of-way (the area between the sidewalk and the City's sewer main that usually runs in the center of the street) If you have a Public Sewer Cleanout and are experiencing sewer problems, please call Public Works at: (925) 779-6950; 24 hours per day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year.

HOMES *WITHOUT* **A PUBLIC SEWER CLEANOUT**. Clearing a stoppage may require additional plumbing work that will not be performed by the City. Residents are encouraged to install an approved Public Sewer Cleanout which allows the City to Maintain the Public Sewer Lateral.

If a Private Sewer Lateral without a public cleanout requires replacement within the public right-of-way, it becomes the property owner's responsibility.

The next step for you to take towards understanding the requirements of installing a Public Sewer Cleanout that conforms to City standards is to contact the City's Building Division with questions regarding permits and/or the construction details at (925) 779-7065 or <u>http://www.ci.antioch.ca.us/CommentForms/commdev.asp</u>.

Ramp Meters Activate October 17 and October 31, 2017 Watch For New Signals at On-Ramps

CONTRA COSTA COUNTY – The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) will activate ramp metering on Route 4 in Contra Costa County beginning October 17, 2017.

What is Ramp Metering? Ramp metering is a traffic management strategy using traffic signals and accompanying equipment and techniques to

manage on-ramp flow on the freeway system. It is intended to improve the safety of vehicle merging and the flow of traffic on the highway.

Westbound Activation. In the first stage of ramp meter activation in Contra Costa County, ramp meters will be activated on westbound Route 4 from Sand Creek Road in Brentwood to Alhambra Avenue in Martinez.

- Beginning Tuesday, October 10th, on-ramp meters were set to solid green during commute times to alert drivers to the new driving condition.
- On Tuesday, October 17th, ramp meters will cycle through red and green during morning commute hours, from 5:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m.

Drivers entering Route 4 where ramp meters are activated should stop at red and wait until the metering light turns green to the freeway. Caltrans will monitor traffic conditions and operate ramp meters, as appropriate.

Eastbound Activation. In the next stage of ramp meter activation in Contra Costa County, ramp meters will be activated on eastbound Route 4 from Alhambra Avenue in Martinez to Lone Tree Way (East) in Brentwood.

- Beginning Tuesday, October 10th, on-ramp meters will be set to solid green during commute times to alert drivers to the new driving condition.
- On Tuesday, October 31st, ramp meters will cycle through red and green during afternoon commute hours, from 2:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.



Additional Information. Many of the on-ramps in Contra Costa County have a carpool lane marked with a diamond. The carpool lane restriction for an on-ramp is 24-hours per day, seven days a week.
