
Thank you!

Traffic Unit

The goal of the Traffic Unit is to enforce traffic laws within the city and ultimately to reduce the number of traffic collisions. Areas of enforcement for the Traffic Unit are based on collision data, traffic volume, traffic conditions, and information from the public. The Antioch Police Department's Traffic Unit has specialized training in the areas of collision investigation and reconstruction as well as traffic enforcement and the safe operation of a police motorcycle. Though no one wants to see one of these officers behind them, their goal is our community's safety, so give them a smile and a wave next time you see them. Officer Prieto was

recently transferred from patrol to our Traffic Unit, bringing the total of full-time Traffic Officers to four, working various hours throughout the day.

Mattress Recycling Council (MRC) Program

Code Enforcement continues to participate in the Mattress Recycling Council (MRC) program operated by the State of California's Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (Cal Recycle). Since joining the program in June 2019, the Code Enforcement Division has collected 580 mattresses, resulting in \$8,700 returned to the City. The Code Enforcement Division is committed to protecting and enhancing the quality of life, health, safety, and welfare of our community. News in Code Enforcement

Code Enforcement recently hired three new officers, bringing the total to four; and three new



Abatement Team members, bringing the total to four. This addition of more Code Enforcement Officers has allowed the City to move to a quadrant system for enforcement activity. In this system, a Code Enforcement Officer is assigned to a specific quadrant in the City and is responsible for responding to citizen complaints and conducting proactive enforcement activities within that assigned quadrant.

In addition to streamlining enforcement activity, this system creates a partnership with the community by allowing residents to build a positive relationship with the Code Enforcement Officer assigned to their neighborhood. It also provides neighborhoods with a Code Enforcement Officer that is available to attend neighborhood meetings and discuss code enforcement activity specific to their neighborhood. Our Abatement Team members are assigned quadrants in the same manner as a Code Enforcement Officer, with each team member responding to resident complaints and proactively abating illegally dumped junk/rubbish, abandoned shopping carts and graffiti.

Code Enforcement recently concluded the Neighborhood Cleanup/Dumpster Days pilot program. This program consisted of 10 cleanup events held at various locations throughout the City. Residents with active garbage service through our approved hauler, Republic Services, receive a postcard approximately 30 days before the event. The postcard details the time, location, and acceptable items to bring to the event, which are appropriately disposed of, free of charge. During this pilot program, over 194 tons of debris has been collected and properly disposed.

Construction Notice/Traffic Alert

A contractor with the City of Antioch will be implementing temporary traffic control on northbound Contra Loma Blvd. between Fitzuren Road and the eastbound onramp to Highway 4 starting 10/29 through 11/15 to replace a failed water main. The roadway will be restricted to a single lane in the construction zone; the highway onramp will remain open.



Night Survey Work

The Street Maintenance Crews will be conducting its annual nighttime survey beginning Monday, November 4th through the month of December from 5:30– 9:30 p.m. The purpose of this work is to identify deficient reflectivity on signs and traffic markings, street light outages, and other nighttime sensitive items relative to keeping the City's roadway safe.

Storm/Power Outages:

Public Works crews continue clean-up efforts from the windstorms. The five-day forecast is not anticipating high winds in our area; however, we want to assure you that Public Works is prepared for anything that may come our way 24/7. Our equipment has been checked and fueled; generators at all facilities have been inspected. In the event PG&E shuts down power, it could take up to five days to restore power. Residents are encouraged to plan accordingly:

- Fuel up vehicles
- Have flashlights on hand instead of candles
- Charge mobile phones, other devices, and rechargeable batteries.
- Stock up on water, ice, and non-perishable food supplies for at least 72 hours


