BART to Antioch reaches one-millionth rider milestone

The BART to Antioch extension carried it's one-millionth rider this week, just five months after the debut of the new service in East Contra Costa County. The tremendous success of the extension has pushed the demand for parking at the Antioch Station beyond the available space. To address this need, BART announced last month plans to nearly double the number of spaces with the addition of 851 spots expected to be open in the fall of 2020.

Canine Team

We are pleased to announce the appointment of Officer Shipilov and K9-Tzak "Tak" as our 6th Canine Team. We were fortunate to hire Officer Shipilov along with K9-Tzak, who both worked at the Brentwood Police Department before joining the Antioch Police. Officer Shipilov is a 10-year veteran, and K9-Tzak has two ½-years of patrol experience. K9-Tzak is a four ½-year-old Belgian Malinois, who originally came from the Czech Republic. With the addition of Officer Shipilov and K9-Tzak, our Canine Unit is now fully staffed with one Canine Team on every



patrol shift. Our canines serve a significant role at the police department by helping apprehend criminals and assisting us in locating missing persons, as well as locating drugs, evidence, and firearms. These canine partners help keep our officers safe while serving our community members in ways our officers can't. Officer Shipilov and K9-Tzak are very excited to serve together as patrol partners here in Antioch.



Volunteers in Police Service

On October 25, 2018, our 20th class of Volunteers in Police Service (VIPS) graduated. These dedicated citizens attended a week-long academy where they received police related training from several instructors at the department. After the academy, they receive additional field training from our experienced volunteers on the various duties they will be performing. Our Police Volunteers provide valuable services to our

Costco Wholesale at 2201 Verne Roberts Circlet has submitted an application for an expansion of their gas station service area. The proposed fuel facility expansion consists of the installation of four new multi-product dispensers and a 3,360 square-foot fueling canopy expansion (7,200 square feet total). The canopy



expansion is designed to match the existing structure and will include a tan, metal-wrapped canopy fascia with a cornice and CMU wrapped canopy columns. This expansion will reduce lines and make it more convenient to purchase gas from Costco.



Environmental

November 1st marks the beginning of the Winter Spare the Air program. In the wintertime, particulate matter — especially particulate matter 2.5 microns or smaller in size, also known as PM2.5 — can become a serious problem in the region. To protect public health, the Air District will issue a Winter Spare the Air Alert when PM2.5 concentrations are expected to be unhealthy. From November 1 through the end of February, when a Winter Spare the Air Alert has been called, burning wood, fire-logs,

pellets, or any other solid fuels in your fireplace, wood-stove, or other wood-burning device is illegal. Follow these links for more information on the Air District's wood-burning regulation, and instructions on how to comply. Sub-contractors working with the Air District will be going door to door in Antioch starting on November 15th to educate residents and survey our community. You can also file a wood smoke complaint online.



Early Voting



Night Survey Work

The Street Maintenance Crews will be conducting its annual nighttime survey beginning Monday, November 5th through the month of December from 5:30 p.m. – 9:30 p.m. (weather permitting). The crew will be driving a City utility truck identifiable by the reflective 'NIGHT SURVEY' placards on its doors. The purpose of this work is to identify deficient reflectivity on signs and traffic markings, street light outages and other nighttime sensitive items relative to keeping the City's roadways safe.







What is a V-Ditch?

You may have seen a v-ditch and not known what it is or why we need them. During the winter months, v-ditches play an important role in collecting and conveying storm-water. Over time vegetation and sediment collects in the v-ditches. Periodic removal of this material is required to maintain the hydraulic capacity of the ditches and protect the roadway and traveling public. Our NPDES crews routinely clean v-ditches as part of our preventative maintenance programs; this work helps keep Antioch cleaner and safer for everyone. We are starting our V-Ditch cleaning season so keep an eye out for our crews.
