



Mayor and Members of the City Council:

This is the City Manager's Report for the week ending November 17, 2017.

### CITY MANAGER'S OFFICE

The City Council continues to take bold steps to bolster economic development and quality of life in Antioch. Tuesday night's City Council Meeting saw them take three important actions by approving:

- 1. The long awaited sale of Humphrey's Restaurant to Sean McCauley Investments (SMI), who will be improving the building and bring in the owners of the quality dining restaurant, Zephyr's Grill and Bar, to the Antioch Marina. This continues our efforts to revitalize historic downtown Antioch.
- The rezoning and the green light for the construction of Rocketship Charter School. Rocketship will be a K through 5<sup>th</sup> grade public school with 600 children. The project will invest over \$14M in the Cavallo/East 18<sup>th</sup> Street area, bringing a much needed boost to this area.
- 3. In an effort to continue their strong desire to see businesses and jobs brought and expanded in Antioch, Council approved funding for an Economic Development Director. The position will provide an expert in this area who will hunt down companies and employers that would benefit from the many positives Antioch and our region has to offer.

These three actions demonstrate the Council's commitment to seeing Antioch redevelop blighted and underutilized properties, provide jobs and improve our community's quality of life.

In an effort to provide better and easier ways to report problems and code violations in our community, the **SeeClickFix** mobile app now includes Code Enforcement. This is one of the many ways we're continuing to improve access and responsiveness to our residents and businesses.



### ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

#### One Marina Plaza Sold for \$1,200,000!

On November 14<sup>th</sup> the City Council unanimously approved the sale of the old Humphrey's Restaurant at the Antioch Marina to Sean McCauley Investments, Inc. (SMI). SMI is planning to renovate the building and has a tenant for the building with 30 years of restaurant experience. #### COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Housing & CDBG. Tabora Gardens Senior Apartments, by Satellite Affordable Housing Associates (SAHA) is now accepting applications for senior one-bedroom, one-bathroom apartments located at 3701 Tabora Drive (at James Donlon Blvd.) in Antioch. All applications must be postmarked by NOVEMBER 21, 2017 (11/21/17) to be considered for the waiting list and lottery.

This project was partially funded by the City of Antioch Housing Successor Agency, CDBG, and Neighborhood Stabilization Funds (HUD). This beautiful new apartment complex features:

- On-site resident services and property management
- Activity rooms with computers
- Exercise room
- 5 laundry rooms
- Meditation area
- Extensive grounds on 3.2 acre site
- Nearby open space reserve



Rent is \$938 per unit, with a minimum income of \$22,512 and a maximum income of \$36,550 for one (1) person, \$41,750 for two (2) people, or \$46,950 for three (3) people.

**Planning Division.** On November 1, 2017, the City Council approved the Rocketship Public Charter School project at 1700 Cavallo Road. The school will host 600 students and is expected to open in the Fall of 2018.





In addition, the Planning Commission recommended that the City Council approve Citywide amendments to the General Plan Land Use Element. This project is mostly a housekeeping effort and updates the Land Use Element to reflect past council actions, to consider recent regional actions, and to accommodate the Downtown Specific Plan. The City Council will consider this item at its November 28, 2017 meeting.

On November 28, 2017, the City Council will consider adoption of the Downtown Specific Plan, which provides a comprehensive planning strategy for the greater downtown Antioch area. The Plan provides unique policies to spur re-investment in Downtown Antioch's commercial and mixed use districts, and promotes improvements and preservation in the adjacent residential neighborhoods. The Downtown Specific Plan will ease procedural hurdles and provide current and progressive policies to encourage economic development and revitalization Downtown.

### PUBLIC WORKS

The rainy season is upon us and we wanted to share a few tips to help us all be prepared.

Following is a short list of tasks Public Works performs prior to storms:

- Storm Drain Inlets in City Streets Cleaned
- Chainsaws & Equipment Fueled and Prepared
- Emergency Generators and Pumps Inspected and Prepared
- Vehicles Fuel Tanks Filled and Ready to Respond
- Flooded Streets Barricades Prepared and Ready to Post
- Sand Bag Station Inspected and at Capacity
- Proactive Pothole Crew Prior and During Wet Weather
- Nighttime Light Survey for Street Light Outages
- Facility Inspections Roofs and Gutters

The sandbag distribution site is located at the City's corporation yard at 1201 W. 4<sup>th</sup> Street; the sandbag station is self-serve and costs \$1.00 per bag. During normal





business hours come to the Public Works office to pay for the bags. During storms the station is open and available 24 hours a day; after 4:00 p.m. and on weekdays you will enter at W 4<sup>th</sup> and N Streets. The sandbag station is on the right hand side just before the gate.

For your well being and safety at home, keep a watchful eye for leaves and debris collecting in the curb and gutter to ensure the storm drains remain clear to prevent street flooding. Have battery-operated flashlights and radios with fresh batteries ready. If you have a telephone system that requires electricity to work (such as a cordless phone or answering machine), plan for alternate communication; have a standard telephone handset, cellular telephone or pager ready as a backup. If your property has a history of flooding, take advantage of the City's sandbag station BEFORE the storm hits. The threat of flooding is greatest at high tide. Please contact Public Works to report street flooding, fallen trees or limbs, plugged storm drains or culverts, traffic signals or street lights out, or street signs down. During storms downed trees and limbs will be cleared from the roadway and cleanup crews will return to pick up debris after the storm. Our phone lines can become very busy during major storms, so we ask for your patience and encourage electronic methods of contact for non-emergency issues.

If you see a downed power line, always assume it is energized and keep yourself and others away. Call 911 immediately to report the location of the downed line then 1-800-743-5002, PG&E's 24-Hour Emergency line. ### POLICE

On November 8, 2017, APD Evidence conducted another purge of guns, fake guns, dangerous weapons, and other similar items that were marked for destruction. Some of the firearms dated back to as early as 2001, though the majority of the guns were from 2012/2013 cases that have been adjudicated. The total weight of all items destroyed came out to be an impressive 2,400 pounds! This means a LOT of brass knuckles, knives, swords, pellet guns, fake guns, and real guns will not fall into the hands of those who should not be in possession of such items.





On November 8, 2017, Antioch Police Officers attended the Contra Costa County Survivors Reunion Luncheon. Sergeant Stenger and Officers McDonald, and Gerber were reunited with a member of the Bonner family who had a potential life threatening medical emergency but since has made a full recovery. We are fortunate to have so many great Officers and EMS partners in Antioch to provide aid to our citizens during their greatest time of need.

Officers from our traffic unit led the procession. Many of our Officers and VIPS are veterans who have served our country prior to serving our city.
