




Community Development

Code Enforcement

On Monday, November 26, the Abatement Team of the Code Enforcement Division, along with the Public Works Department, was very busy working hard to respond to vandalism and graffiti throughout Downtown Antioch. A primary goal of the Abatement Team is to provide immediate response to reports of graffiti and to remove and repaint the areas. Early reporting and covering of graffiti discourages "taggers" and eliminates the visible eyesore and blight. Downtown Specific Plan Focus Area

On Tuesday, November 27, 2018, the City Council approved the rezoning of those parcels located within the Downtown Specific Plan Focus Area. These parcels previously contained a variety of residential and commercial zoning designations, which were superseded by the Downtown Specific Plan when it was adopted earlier this year. This action will eliminate a potential source of confusion and will help to fully implement the Downtown Specific Plan.



Preliminary Development Plan

On Tuesday, December 5, 2018, the Planning Commission will consider a Preliminary Development Plan for a new residential subdivision in the Sand Creek Focus Area.

The project is called Creekside-Vineyards at Sand Creek and consists of 220 single-family homes on 158 acres south of Sand Creek and the



future Sand Creek Road extension.

City Council Meetings



Sandbag Station

The City's sandbag distribution site is up and running. The station is located at the City's corporation yard at 1201 W 4th Street; the sandbag station is self-serve and costs \$1.00 per bag. 7:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. Come to the Public Works office to pay for the bags. During storms the station is open and available 24 hours a day; after 4:00 p.m. on weekdays you will enter at West 4th and N Streets, the sandbag station is on the right-hand side just before the gate.





Water Main Break

Water Distribution crews responded to a water main break in the afternoon of Tuesday, November 27th. The main break occurred on Eagleridge Drive near Lone Tree Way. The repairs

continued into the early morning hours the next day. Aged infrastructure caused the break. Visit our Facebook page to view a short video of the repairs. https://www.facebook.com/antiochpublicworks/

Water service was briefly interrupted while the crew isolated the break. Customers affected by the main break may experience sediment in their water or air (banging noises) in their plumbing. If this occurs, running water through the highest faucet or the faucet in the backyard usually clears the line. If the problem persists, please contact Public Works and we will send a crew out to resolve the issue.



Grant Funded Projects

The City has completed the installation of a brand new flashing crosswalk in front of Antioch Middle School. This installation is part of a larger grant project to update the school crossing signs and markings to increase safety around the school. This project is just one example of what the City is doing to keep students and drivers safe from traffic and pedestrian accidents.


