My message focused on the loss of local control through more and more legislation handed down from Sacramento from affordable housing and improved energy efficiency building codes (which are mutually exclusive) to unfunded mandates on zero litter by 2022. The City Council's goal is to focus on things we do have control over, like paying down our unfunded liabilities or securing our valuable water rights to posture our community for the wave of jobs and higher density housing that is coming our way. Division will be using the new 2019 Building Codes. The City of Antioch adopts and uses State building codes for the construction of new buildings and alterations of existing buildings. These building codes address methods of construction, energy efficiency, and general life safety issues. Every few years, the codes are updated by the State. This upcoming code change will introduce significant changes that will significantly improve energy efficiency in new homes. The State of California and the City of Antioch view these improvements as a means to reduce carbon emissions and promote more sustainable development. Register to vote online or update your current registration. Voter Registration forms are also available at the City Clerk's Department with free postage.

You are eligible to register to vote if you are:

- A United States citizen,
- 18 years of age or older on Election Day,
- Not in prison, on parole, serving state prison sentence in a county jail, or serving sentence for a felony, and
- Not found to be mentally incompetent by a court of law

You need to update your voter registration if you:

- Move to a new residence
- Change your name, or
- Want to change your political party affiliation **Click here for more information.





Winter Preparedness

Public Works Water Distribution team is preparing for the winter months by increasing our inventory of pipes and equipment necessary to make emergency repairs. We also keep a watchful eye on areas that have been problematic in the past winters. Following are some simple steps you can do to prepare your home for the cold months:

- 1. Shut off irrigation if not in use during the winter.
- 2. Insulate all exposed exterior pipes with insulating foam wrap.
- 3. Insulate pipes in crawl spaces, attic, & garage.
- 4. Disconnect garden hoses.

During storms, the station is open and available 24 hours a day; after 4:00 p.m. on weekdays enter at West 4th and N Streets, the sandbag station is on the right-hand side just before the gate.




