

Phone Scams

The phone scammers are at it again! Our dispatch center has been contacted by many of our residents who are getting scammed. These scammers call and say they are with Social Security and use various tactics to convince people they have an outstanding debt. They prey on people's emotions and even threaten to send the Antioch Police to arrest them if they don't comply (we would never come to arrest you for this!). These calls originate from outside the United States, but the scammers spoof their caller ID to make it look like they're calling from a Social Security Office. Sometimes they even spoof their number to make it look like they're calling from Antioch Police Department! Please don't ever send money, gift cards, or give any of your personal identification information to someone calling YOU on the phone.

If you are in doubt, call your local Social Security Office directly or call us and we will help you.

New Commissioner Appointed

On Thursday, the newest member of the Parks and Recreation Commission was seated. Ms. Deirdre Peckenham was appointed to fill a current vacancy, and her term expires in April 2022. The Commission held nine meetings in 2019, including a joint meeting with the Police Crime Prevention Commission outside in a park.



Proposed Municipal Code Amendment

On January 14, 2020, the Community Development Department will be presenting a proposed amendment to the Antioch Municipal Code to improve compliance with the City's requirement that all occupied structures subscribe to and maintain trash and recycling service. Within the City of Antioch, all occupied homes and commercial/industrial properties must



have trash and recycling services. These services are provided by Republic Services, the City's franchised solid waste operator. The Code Enforcement Division has received complaints of properties, primarily residential, that do not maintain trash and recycling services. In these cases, the residents might either place their trash in their neighbor's bins or commercial bins without permission or some cases, illegally dump their garbage elsewhere in the City. None of these alternatives is acceptable.

The proposed amendment would state that any property maintaining water service is considered "occupied" and, as such, must maintain garbage and recycling service with Republic Services. Owners of those properties that currently have water service, but do not have garbage and recycling services will be notified and directed to subscribe to service or risk being issued a citation. Tenants will not be cited, as it is the responsibility of the owner to ensure service. There will be a process to allow exceptions to account for unique circumstances when water service may be provided without garbage service. In such a case, an exception form will be required. If you do not currently have garbage and recycling service, please contact Republic Services to subscribe at www.republicservices.com or at (925) 685-4711.

- 18 years of age or older on Election Day,
- Not in prison, on parole, serving state prison sentence in a county jail, or serving sentence for a felony, and
- Not found to be mentally incompetent by a court of law

You need to update your voter registration if you:

- Move to a new residence
- Change your name, or
- Want to change your political party affiliation
