Contra Costa Event Park

The Contra Costa Event Park (aka Antioch Fairgrounds), home of the Contra Costa County Fair, is rebranding their image and what they have to offer. Similar to the City, it has developed a reputation over the years that doesn't accurately represent who they are and want to become. Mayor Wright,

Being on state-owned land in an unincorporated island within the City, the county's only fair is marketing their 80-acre site to be much more. We want to see continued success for this important part of Antioch's past, present, and future.



CCWD

Contra Costa Water District (CCWD)
General Manager Jerry Brown hosted a
quarterly get-together for City
Manager's, and we had an opportunity

to hear what is being planned for their treated and untreated water customers. Antioch buys about two-thirds of our untreated water from CCWD and treats it before distributing to our 115,000 residential customers and businesses. An 8% increase in raw water cost is being proposed which will impact the overall cost of water to Antioch customers. City staff is still reviewing how this increase has been calculated and is committed to providing the best quality, lowest cost water for our residents and customers.

Antioch Citizen's Academy

Along with Chief Brooks and his executive staff, it was an honor to welcome the 24 participants and their family and friends to the Antioch Citizens Academy graduation. This intensive 10-week program taught everyday folks what it is like to walk in the shoes of an Antioch, police officer. 



Code Enforcement

On December 11, 2018, the City Council introduced an ordinance to increase the citation amounts for violations of the Municipal Code. This amount is generally controlled by the State of California and recent legislation allowed for higher amounts. The citation amount for a first, second and third+ citation went from \$100/\$200/\$500 to \$130/\$700/\$1,300, respectively. In addition, recurring code violations at commercial buildings can now result in citations in the amount of \$2,500.The Code Enforcement



Division is committed first to seeing that code violations are resolved, but are also committed to being good stewards of the resources that the City Council has invested in their efforts and in pursuing lawful means to recover costs. In all first-time cases, property owners are given at least one opportunity to correct a violation prior to a citation. Only when these opportunities are not taken, do the Code Enforcement Officers turn to citations. More information about Code Enforcement can be found here.

Preparation for Winter Months

Our Water Distribution team is preparing for the winter months by increasing our inventory of pipes and equipment necessary to make emergency repairs. We also keep a watchful eye on areas that have been problematic in the past winters.

Following are a few steps to help prepare your home for the cold months:

- Insulate all exposed exterior pipes with insulating foam wrap.
- Shut off water systems (irrigation/garden hoses) not in use during the winter.
- Make sure all household members know how to shut the water off at the domestic main valve in the event of a burst pipe.
