CHEMCIAL AGENT (CTS CS) AND CHEMICAL AGENT MASK (AVON FM53) TRAINING – APD SWAT

1. AVON MASK (FM53)

Operators will be briefed and trained on the nomenclature of mask, proper deployment techniques, and appropriate donning and doffing procedures in a chemical agent environment.

2. AVON MASK STORAGE AND CLEANING

Operators will be trained how to properly carry their mask, store their mask, and how to clean mask after exposure.

3. CHEMICAL AGENT EXPOSURE

Operators will have a chemical agent exposure in a (2-chlorobenzalmalononitrile) "CS gas," environment, learning how to operate in the environment and how to clear mask if exposed
